### Admission

MSU Meridian is an upper-division regional campus of Mississippi State University. Courses are offered at the junior, senior, and graduate levels. Degrees are offered at the bachelor's, master's and specialist levels. Specific entrance requirements are listed in the current university catalog. New student applications should be submitted prior to registration and may be submitted online at [www.msstate.edu](http://www.msstate.edu) by selection the "Apply Online" icon.

### Readmission

A student that has not been enrolled at MSU for the spring semester must complete a "Readmission Application" and submit it to MSU-Meridian Student Services. This process must be completed before your current registration can be processed.

### International Student Admission

International students must apply for admission in advance of the beginning date of classes so that the Office of International Programs can establish their eligibility for admission. Refer to the current university catalog for the admission documents required of international students. International students are also required to provide health and repatriation insurance (see fee schedule).

### Orientation 2014

Incoming transfer and graduate students are invited to participate in the new student Orientation program in order to become better acquainted with the campus and the university. At Orientation, students will learn about important university procedures, as well as campus resources, such as computer labs, library facilities, and web registration.

### Academic Transcripts

All undergraduate students must submit an official transcript from all previous colleges attended. To guarantee class enrollment, it is recommended that transcripts be submitted prior to registration. Graduate students (individuals who hold a bachelor's degree or above), who are seeking an advanced degree from MSU, must submit an official transcript showing their highest degree attained and any coursework subsequent to obtaining their degree. Graduate students who are not seeking a degree may enroll as an unclassified graduate and are required to submit a transcript that states a bachelor's degree.

### MMR Immunization Documentation

By state mandate, students born in 1957 or after are required to provide proof of immunity to Measles and Rubella. Proof consists of one of the following:

- (1) Documented history of two doses of Measles vaccine and one of rubella (usually given as MMR).
- (2) Laboratory evidence of immunity to Measles and Rubella
- (3) Documentation of history of physician diagnosed Measles and Rubella. Students who have documented a significant life-threatening allergic reaction to this particular vaccine are exempt from this immunization but must complete the Compliance form.

### Tuition and Required Fees

Meridian Based Student Tuition and Fees - Summer 2014

Fees are charged based on a student's classification as a graduate or undergraduate student and not on the level of the course taken. Students are classified as graduate if they hold a bachelor's degree and are not seeking a second bachelor's degree. The following fees are for Meridian based students.

International Student Health/Repatriation Insurance Required (contact the Office of Student Services for current fee information)

Alternate insurance must be approved by the Office of International Programs by the 10<sup>th</sup> day of classes, otherwise, there will be no refund of this insurance assessment.

Senior Citizens (age 60 or over) – Mississippi senior citizens may take courses without paying tuition and required fees. Registration is on a space available basis and must be done after classes begin.

### Fee Bills

You are responsible for any charges to your student receivable account. A consolidated statement of your account with Mississippi State University will be available on the web around the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month with a due date approximately 25 days from the billing date. Please check the following Student Account Services website for information and instructions: <http://www.controller.msstate.edu/sas/>; then click on "Account Info". There will a 1.5% monthly service fee on amounts unpaid more than 25 days from billing.

### Unpaid Fees

Any outstanding and past due amounts owed to the university must be paid in full before a student may register. Students may not receive a transcript or diploma until the account is cleared. Accounts past due over 90 days are subject to collection proceedings.

### Financial Aid

Federal aid in the form of grants, loans, and workstudy is available to qualifying students. Students who plan to use financial aid funds to pay fees must apply for aid at least six weeks in advance of registration. Students who wish to defer payment of fees pending receipt of financial aid must have complete financial aid applications, which mean MSU must have received all required financial aid documents.

### Veterans Educational Assistance

Students who wish to receive VA Educational Assistance should contact the MSU-Meridian Veterans Representative, in MSU-Meridian Student Services to complete the necessary forms to receive VA benefits.

### Textbooks

The MSU-Meridian Bookstore is located on the upper level. Students receiving approved financial aid or other sponsor assistance which covers textbooks, may charge textbooks pending MSU's receipt of aid. A "Bookstore Charge Authorization" must be obtained from Student Services and students will need a current student I.D. before charging books. Textbook charge authorizations will be available for pickup on Tuesday June 3rd, for students with pre-approved financial aid. Charge authorizations are valid for charging textbooks for the period of June 3-June 17, 2014. Students who receive financial aid refunds/disbursements prior to the posting of bookstore charges to their accounts will be liable for the bookstore charge and will be assessed the 1.5 percent service fee on unpaid balances.

### Application for Degree/Graduation and Commencement

Candidates for degree should file a formal application for degree by 12:00 midnight June 20, 2014 via banner web if they expect to complete degree requirements by the end of the summer semester. If for any reason a student does not graduate as previously anticipated, he/she will need to consult with their academic advisor and re-apply for degree. **The degree audit fee is \$50.00 and will be charged to the student's account. There is also a late degree audit fee of \$100.00 if filed during June 21-July18, 2014. The fee will increase to \$250.00 if filed during July 19-August 4, 2014.**

### Parking Decals

All students who bring a vehicle on campus must register that vehicle with the university. Vehicle tag numbers will be required for each decal issued. Decals may be purchased at MSU-Meridian Campus Police Office.

### Traffic Fines

Traffic fines are assessed to students without a current parking decal and those improperly parked. Fines may be paid in the MSU-Meridian Cashier's Office.

### I.D. Cards

All students are required to obtain, and have in their possession at all times, a valid MSU-Meridian Student I.D. This card is required to use the MCC Library, the MSU Computer Lab, and to participate in other university activities as may be sponsored. Students must show their I.D. Card upon the request of an MSU Campus Police Officer or designated university official. ID cards may be obtained in the Campus Police Office.

### Class Room Assignments

Room assignments are completed the day before classes begin and will be available at the Campus Police Office (located just inside the main entrance of MSU-Meridian) beginning the first day of classes.

### Schedule Changes

There are no mass voids for non payment of fees, it is your responsibility to withdraw from the University. All schedule changes (adds/drops) must be made through the student's academic advisor and then submitted to the Office of MSU-Meridian Student Services for processing. Please refer to the 2014 Summer Academic Calendar for these dates. A change of schedule fee of \$50.00 may be added to your account for each schedule change.

**Admission**

MSU Meridian is an upper-division regional campus of Mississippi State University. Courses are offered at the junior, senior, and graduate levels. Degrees are offered at the bachelor's, master's and specialist levels. Specific entrance requirements are listed in the current university catalog. New student applications should be submitted prior to registration and may be submitted online at [www.msstate.edu](http://www.msstate.edu) by selecting the "Apply Online" icon.

**Readmission**

A student that has not been enrolled at MSU for the spring semester must complete a "Readmission Application" and submit it to MSU-Meridian Student Services. This process must be completed before your current registration can be processed.

**International Student Admission**

International students must apply for admission in advance of the beginning date of classes so that the Office of International Programs can establish their eligibility for admission. Refer to the current university catalog for the admission documents required of international students. International students are also required to provide health and repatriation insurance (see fee schedule).

**Orientation 2014**

Incoming transfer and graduate students are invited to participate in the new student Orientation program in order to become better acquainted with the campus and the university. At Orientation, students will learn about important university procedures, as well as campus resources, such as computer labs, library facilities, and web registration.

**Academic Transcripts**

All undergraduate students must submit an official transcript from all previous colleges attended. To guarantee class enrollment, it is recommended that transcripts be submitted prior to registration. Graduate students (individuals who hold a bachelor's degree or above), who are seeking an advanced degree from MSU, must submit an official transcript showing their highest degree attained and any coursework subsequent to obtaining their degree. Graduate students who are not seeking a degree may enroll as an unclassified graduate and are required to submit a transcript that states a bachelor's degree.

**MMR Immunization Documentation**

By state mandate, students born in 1957 or after are required to provide proof of immunity to Measles and Rubella. Proof consists of one of the following:  
 (1) Documented history of two doses of Measles vaccine and one of rubella (usually given as MMR).  
 (2) Laboratory evidence of immunity to Measles and Rubella  
 (3) Documentation of history of physician diagnosed Measles and Rubella. Students who have documented a significant life-threatening allergic reaction to this particular vaccine are exempt from this immunization but must complete the Compliance form.

Senior Citizens (age 60 or over) – Mississippi senior citizens may take courses without paying tuition and required fees. Registration is on a space available basis and must be done after classes begin.

**Fee Bills**

You are responsible for any charges to your student receivable account. A consolidated statement of your account with Mississippi State University will be available on the web around the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month with a due date approximately 25 days from the billing date. Please check the following Student Account Services website for information and instructions: <http://www.controller.msstate.edu/sas/>; then click on "Account Info". There will be a 1.5% monthly service fee on amounts unpaid more than 25 days from billing.

**Unpaid Fees**

Any outstanding and past due amounts owed to the university must be paid in full before a student may register. Students may not receive a transcript or diploma until the account is cleared. Accounts past due over 90 days are subject to collection proceedings.

**Financial Aid**

Federal aid in the form of grants, loans, and workstudy is available to qualifying students. Students who plan to use financial aid funds to pay fees must apply for aid at least six weeks in advance of registration. Students who wish to defer payment of fees pending receipt of financial aid must have complete financial aid applications, which mean MSU must have received all required financial aid documents.

**Veterans Educational Assistance**

Students who wish to receive VA Educational Assistance should contact the MSU-Meridian Veterans Representative, in MSU-Meridian Student Services to complete the necessary forms to receive VA benefits.

**Textbooks**

The MSU-Meridian Bookstore is located on the upper level. Students receiving approved financial aid or other sponsor assistance which covers textbooks, may charge textbooks pending MSU's receipt of aid. A "Bookstore Charge Authorization" must be obtained from Student Services and students will need a current student I.D. before charging books. Textbook charge authorizations will be available for pickup on Monday August 18th, for students with pre-approved financial aid. Charge authorizations are valid for charging textbooks for the period of August 18-September 5, 2014. Students who receive financial aid refunds/disbursements prior to the posting of bookstore charges to their accounts will be liable for the bookstore charge and will be assessed the 1.5 percent service fee on unpaid balances.

**Application for Degree/Graduation and Commencement**

Candidates for degree should file a formal application for degree by 12:00 midnight October 15th via banner web if they expect to complete degree requirements by the end of the Fall semester. If for any reason a student does not graduate as previously anticipated, he/she will need to consult with their academic advisor and re-apply for degree. **The degree audit fee is \$50.00 and will be charged to the student's account. There is also a late degree audit fee of \$100.00 if filed during October 16-October 31, 2014. The fee will increase to \$250.00 if filed during November 3-December 2, 2014.**

**Parking Decals**

All students who bring a vehicle on campus must register that vehicle with the university. Vehicle tag numbers will be required for each decal issued. Decals may be purchased at MSU-Meridian Campus Police Office.

**Traffic Fines**

Traffic fines are assessed to students without a current parking decal and those improperly parked. Fines may be paid in the MSU-Meridian Cashier's Office.

**I.D. Cards**

All students are required to obtain, and have in their possession at all times, a valid MSU-Meridian Student I.D. This card is required to use the MCC Library, the MSU Computer Lab, and to participate in other university activities as may be sponsored. Students must show their I.D. Card upon the request of an MSU Campus Police Officer or designated university official. ID cards may be obtained in the Campus Police Office.

**Class Room Assignments**

Room assignments are completed the day before classes begin and will be available at the Campus Police Office (located just inside the main entrance of MSU-Meridian) beginning the first day of classes.

**Schedule Changes**

There are no mass voids for non payment of fees, it is your responsibility to withdraw from the University. All schedule changes (adds/drops) must be made through the student's academic advisor and then submitted to the Office of MSU-Meridian Student Services for processing. Please refer to the 2014 Fall Academic Calendar for these dates. A change of schedule fee of \$50.00 may be added to your account for each schedule change.
